

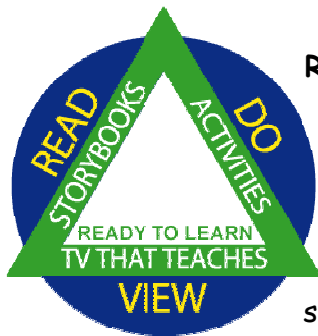


Ready To Learn.



The Learning Triangle - June 2010 *Summer Reading*

The Learning Triangle is teaching young children through a combination of: TV that teaches + storybooks + activities (all related to one theme or skill.) **READ, DO, VIEW.**



READ - "Book! Book! Book!" by Deborah Bruss. When the children leave the farm to go back to school, the bored barnyard animals head to the library in search of something to do but their language ("Neigh! Neigh!" and "Moo! Moo!") is too much noise for the kindly but confused librarian--until a determined hen flaps in and clucks "Book! Book! Book!" Soon, the gang is back on the farm happily having a story hour of their own (the cow even presents a puppet show).

VIEW - "Caillou the Bookworm." This episode takes Caillou and his sister Rosie to the public library for story time and to check out books. While they are at the library, they discover the various sections of the library. They also learn about having to stay quiet while at the library as courtesy to others trying to read. Caillou and Rosie sit with the librarian, Vanessa, to participate in story time about fish. Story time allows Caillou to visualize the story in his head and act as if he is in the story. After story time, Vanessa allows Caillou to borrow the book and the fun and learning begins. *Watch Caillou on WJCT (channel 7 and Comcast channels 8 and 440) weekdays at 12:30 p.m.*

DO - Develop goals for your child for the amount of books to read over the summer and keep a reading log of completed books. Have a conversation with your child before setting this goal. Setting the goal with your child will allow your child to take ownership in the task instead of feeling as if reading is being forced upon him. Remember to teach by example - pick up a book or two yourself and let your child see you enjoying reading!
