With a rich experience spanning over a decade, Esguerra has contributed as a creative, writer, and screenplay consultant for TeleNext Media and Flyover Studios, which produced family-friendly movies. Moreover, she was an integral part of the writers' room for TB Media's Los Angeles-based television series, *QT: Second Shot*.

Her screenplays have garnered acclaim, being officially selected in the Faith in Film International Screenwriting Competition and reaching the quarter-finals in the esteemed Austin Film Festival Screenwriting Competition.
