

Jason Kelloway is a Marine Corps veteran, who served his time with the 2nd Battalion 8th Marines out of Camp Lejeune, NC and was deployed four times. He achieved the rank of Sergeant and has had numerous awards including a Joint Service Achievement Medal for his leadership in a hostile situation in Haiti that saved other Marines and

civilians. Following his service, Jason found himself in a downward spiral, struggling with the challenges of transitioning back into civilian life. Like many veterans, he faced hurdles that were both physical and emotional.

He's dedicated to helping other veterans struggling to transition to civilian life, just as he had once done. The shop employs veterans and provides them with mentorship and support under Jason's guidance.
